The Order of the Minister of External Trade dated 17 February 1962 provides temporary admission facilities in application of the three Conventions listed above and also in certain other cases which include:

- 1. Packings suitable for repeated use whether or not full
- 2. articles for the personal use of travellers crossing the frontier, if not free of duties or restrictions.
